





Chaplain Chats ~ Campus Chaplain, Dan Brookey

Adventure! Just the sound of the word desires movement. Hearing the word makes me want to get out of my chair and do something or go somewhere. At minimum it makes me think about the places I have been and the things I have seen. Unless, of course, it is applied against an antiquated meaning which includes the words peril, danger or risk. I enjoy new adventures. For some, that would be the reason to go on an adventure. As you ruminate on an exciting or very unusual experience in your life you are contemplating an adventure you had in your life. Actually, life can be viewed as an adventure. Each of you have had a meaningful and unique adventure. The stories I have heard telling of the places you have gone and things you have accomplished is just short of incredible. In some cases, they seem like miracles. Your adventures are, in part, what makes my ministry so enjoyable. For that, I thank you. When I think of all the adventures in the Bible, yes the peril and risk as well as the lofty miracles, two words have really captured my thoughts. These two words were spoken by God himself. "Follow Me". Simon and Andrew were out fishing one day and they had just casted their nets when Jesus appears and says "Follow" Me" (Mark 1:17). They didn't ask any questions, had no second thoughts or have any expectations or reservations. They didn't ask to see Jesus' business plan or ask to see the financials. They didn't even want to know what this adventure entailed or what it would cost them. Scripture says, "at once they left their nets and followed him." (Mark 1:18). The Gospels in the New Testament, in part, describes the next three years of adventure and ministry. This led to Easter Sunday which was just a few days ago. I trust you celebrated resurrection Sunday in a fashionable and spiritual way. We are also aware of the days preceding resurrection.
