Chaplain Chats ~

As we enter a new year, we contemplate all the hustle and bustle of Christmas and the New Year celebrations. This time of year, it might seem dark since the Christmas lights and decorations are packaged for next year's Christmas Celebration. We are determined to re-explore the memories created during the holiday. But wait, on the first Christmas the Magi had not even realized Christ had been born. And they certainly didn't know where. So, technically, Christmas is not over. And for the first Christmas it wouldn't be over for another two years. The Three Magi (maybe more) had been instructed to follow a star. In doing so, they realized that this star would guide them along a long arduous path. With complete satisfaction finding a baby, they set out from the East. Scripture tells us these Magi arrived in Bethlehem and were ready to meet such a special "gift". Matthew 2:1-2 reveals their arrival: ***After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."***

This entourage of people left all they had to pursue the one who came to pursue them. Without God's light and His glory, the Magi would have, more than likely, either gotten lost, misdirected or given up looking for the Son of God. But they didn't give up because God didn't give up on them. They were directed by that star until it settled over the place where Jesus was born. Like the Magi, King Herod wanted to find out when and where the Messiah was to be born so he summoned the Magi to partner with them to find Jesus. Herod wanted nothing more than to destroy Jesus as he was afraid, Jesus would become supreme ruler. Matthew 2:7-11a ***Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him." After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.***

To worship means to ascribe worth to something. The Magi worshipped Jesus by presenting him with three items of earthly worth, gold, frankincense and myrrh representing Jesus' royalty, his divinity and his humanity.


