In late November 2025 I saw many paintings and/or pencil drawings Joe Aiken had on display in various areas around Fellowship Square Surprise. Not realizing how many paintings he had done I wondered to myself and mused... “has he every painted a butterfly?” Before I was told he had painted butterflies in the past this mesmerizing “new” painting appeared on a table by the Café that had many of his works. I went right over to Joe as he was in the Café having lunch and told him I wanted a copy of that painting. He had a price list on the painting. And, he had just finished it and brought it down before I inquired about it. I was so happy to get the copy, which he matted and framed for me for an upcharge, no problem. The reason for butterflies is that we have given our 3-year-old granddaughter several items with butterfly themes. One of those was a quilt made by our good friend Karen Hart. When Madelyn unwrapped that quilt, she hugged it as though it were a precious heirloom. Maybe someday it will be if she is able to give it to her granddaughter.

Renumerating on butterflies made me think of a book by Andy Andrews titled “The Butterfly Effect”. If you have read the small coffee table book you know that it isn’t about butterflies, per se, but about people, including you. The premise of the book began with a story of Edward Lorenz who presented to the New York Academy of Science in 1963 a theory. This theory was the premise that a butterfly could flap its wings and set molecules of air in motion, which would move other molecules of air, in turn moving more molecules of air – eventually capable of starting a hurricane on the other side of the planet. This theory, at the time, was literally laughed at and thought to be preposterous.

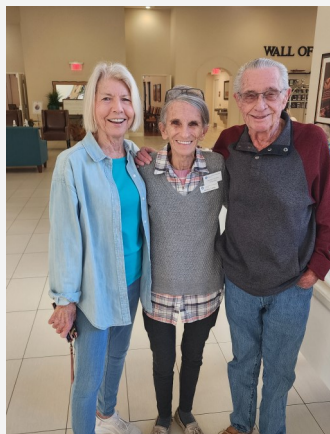
