I have a photo of my dad in uniform when he served in the Army in 1952. My mom is in that photo too. I am not sure if they were married when this photo was taken. None the less, they began their journey together during that time and spent over 50 years together. My parents, along with aunts and uncles and my sister, have all gone to be with the Lord. I say this because there are times when I wish I could call one of them and ask a question about our heritage and my earlier life. Unfortunately, there is no one to talk to. I know a lot about our family but not everything. I know too that there is legacy within our family. Legacy in this case is anything handed down from the past, from ancestors as it were. Once we are gone, we cannot contribute to the conversations regarding the past. What we can do here and now is speak into our families' lives about our past and about their future. The legacy we leave regarding our past can be captured in various ways including discussion, diaries, and auto-biographies. If you are a veteran, you can tell your story through the Veterans History Project. Resident Dick Melick is interviewing veterans to promote this effort.

The legacy from the Bible stories and teachings will enforce the future of our loved ones. When the Apostle Paul opens his second letter to Timothy he knows he will die soon. It seems like Paul wants to continue to pour into Timothy and the legacy that each has in and for the faith. Paul is Timothy's spiritual father and Timothy's mother, and grandmother are Christians who have also been instrumental in Timothy's faith. 2 Timothy 1:3-5 unfolds this generation and spiritual relationship between Paul and Timothy's family. 2 Timothy 1:3-5 ***I thank God, whom I serve, as my ancestors did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also.*** Timothy's mother and grandmother, Eunice and Lois, were early Christian converts and they spoke into Timothy's life in such a way where Timothy was able to speak into others in a powerful and meaningful way. Paul said to Timothy ***"What you have heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching with faith and love in Jesus Christ."*** 2 Timothy 1:13. This poses the question... have we done our best to testify about God's grace, his love and mercy for us? I encourage you to stay the course and use your gifts by the Holy Spirit to tell others about Jesus to make an eternal difference in their lives.
